Changing face of Glory

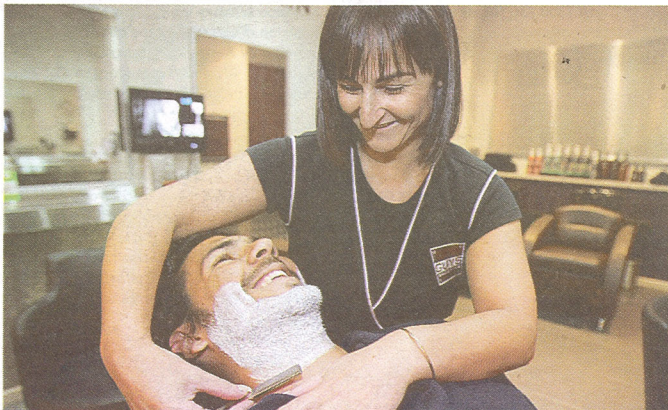
